We are NOT Powerless Against Wildfires - PREVENTION Starts with US!

We're excited to share that Hidden Hills is set to become the only city in California where 100% of parcels will be part of a Firewise Community—a major step in strengthening our wildfire resilience and protecting our homes, property, and natural surroundings.

As a Firewise Community, Hidden Hills is joining a nationally recognized program that empowers residents to take proactive measures to reduce wildfire risks.

What is Firewise?

As Firefighters do not have the resources to defend every home during a wildfire, Firewise communities are those that are officially recognized by the National Fire Protection Association (NFPA) as having taken the appropriate measures to mitigate or prevent wildfire structural damage.

The Firewise USA® program encourages local solutions for wildfire safety by involving homeowners, neighbors, and local agencies in wildfire risk reduction.

Why it Matters?

- Improves community preparedness.
- Reduces wildfire damage risk.
- Helps secure future insurance eligibility.
- Builds stronger partnerships with local fire agencies.

New Ordinance Restricts Fire-Risk Activities on Red Flag Days

In response to the recent devastating fires, the Hidden Hills City Council has taken proactive steps to reduce local fire risk. The Council approved Ordinance No. 393, which restricts certain activities on days when the National Weather Service issues a Red Flag Warning—a designation given during high-risk fire conditions due to strong winds, low humidity, or dry lightning.

The ordinance, developed in coordination with the L.A. County Fire Department, aims to reduce potential ignition sources during these critical times. It went into effect on April 9, 2025, and includes the following prohibited activities during Red Flag Warnings:

1. Use of portable outdoor barbecue grills.
2. Use of any outdoor fire pits, fireplaces, or any outdoor fire of any kind for any purpose.
3. Any outdoor activity that could produce sparks or flames.
4. Use of gasoline or propane powered equipment for home or property maintenance or repair (e.g. mowers, weed eaters, chainsaws, welders, and portable generators). Note: Generators used to provide emergency power to a home or for medical purposes, as well as gasoline-powered pumps used for fire protection, are exempt.
5. Outdoor smoking of tobacco, cannabis, or any other inhalable product.

Residents are encouraged to stay informed about Red Flag conditions and help keep our community safe by observing these restrictions.

City Council Updates

At the Council's Regular Meeting on March 10 2025, the City approved an agreement with PMF Consulting Group to conduct the work necessary to achieve recognition as a Firewise USA Community. California's Safer from Wildfires regulations require insurance companies to provide discounts to homeowners in recognized Firewise USA communities. The program educates residents on creating defensible space and fire-safe infrastructure, reducing the likelihood of catastrophic property loss. (Read about the Firewise program on page 1).

The Council also added a new section to the City's Municipal Code restricting certain activities when Red Flag Warnings are issued due to high-risk brush fire conditions (read about the restricted activities on page 2).

City Council Meetings are held on the 2nd Monday of every month. Meetings start at 5:30 p.m. and can be watched on Channel 3 (Charter/Spectrum Cable) or web streamed via the City's website.

Annual Defensible Space Inspection Program

Brush Clearance Inspection Begin May 1

The Annual Brush Clearance Inspection Program (now referred to as the Defensible Space Inspection Program) is one of the best tools residents can use to protect their homes from a brush fire. Creating defensible space through brush clearance, coupled with home hardening, greatly improves the chance that a house will survive a wildfire.

LA County Fire will begin 2025 Defensible Space Inspections on May 1st in Hidden Hills.

After the inspection, property owners will receive a report showing either "In Compliance" or outlining the violations that need to be corrected. Owners will have a minimum of 30 days to complete corrections. Residents with questions may call the Defensible Space Unit at 626-969-2375.
